 - There is a concern about criminalizing those who live in the area; different is not the same as bad.
 - Latrice Harris-Collins: This is always on Admissions' mind as part of Marquette's identity is urban and Jesuit. There is training for tour guides but know that they can do better.
 - Chief Edith Hudson: Marquette works closely with Near West Side Partners (NWSP) and Menomonee Valley partners, and there is an opportunity to partner with Center for Peacemaking.
 - New student orientation will offer extended programming in this area
 - What kind or work is being done to prepare campus in case of violence or emergency response?
 - MUPD does train extensively and last year brought in emergency management team from university for expanded training. Moving towards preparation. Some staff are part of this and there will be opportunity to connect for future presence during training.
 - Active shooter training is available on MUPD website; MUPD also will do trainings.
 - GROW sessions are available on self-defense or active shooter scenarios.
 - Center for Peacemaking and NWSP: variety of programs where students can be involved such as the Safety Anchor Team and NWS Safety Ambassadors.
