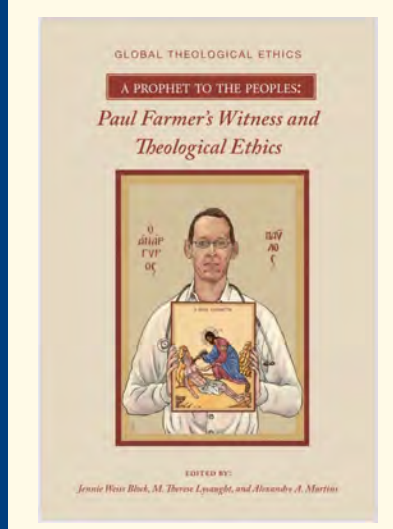

In this panel moderated by Claire Fellbaum, a MU senior student, three experts on global health, bioethics, and theology will engage in a conversation on global health equity. As a global health leader and co-founder of Partners In Health, Paul Farmer was innovative in his way of delivering healthcare to the poorest parts of the world. Liberation theology was a motivation for his work, grounded in a preferential option for the poor in healthcare. Following Farmer's death in Feb. of 2022, a group of international scholars joined together to begin a conversation about Farmer's legacy for global health and theological ethics. As a result, they published: *A Prophet to the Peoples: Paul Farmer's Witness and Theological Ethics*. This book will guide this panel with one co-editors of the book, and external views offered by a global health nursing from Marquette and the Associate Dean for Global Health and Founding Director of Masters in Global Health Equity at MCW.
