Graduation: December, 2009

Wednesday, October 7, 2009

Deadline to apply for December graduation.

If you submit your *Graduation Application* after this date, you will not graduate and you will not receive your diploma. You will have to apply for graduation for a future term.

your program for specific information. Materials must be submitted to the Graduate School or GSM on or before the dates listed below.

2. Results of comprehensive exams due in the Graduate School or GSM. Registration for and the taking of the comp exams—and the turning in of the results—are arranged between the student and his/her program or department.

Wednesday, December 9, 2009

Final day to submit dissertation to the Graduate School with results and signatures.

Graduation: May, 2010

Wednesday, February 3, 2010

Deadline to apply for May graduation.

If you submit your *Graduation Application* after this date, you will not graduate and you will not receive your diploma. You will have to apply for graduation for a future term.

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4. Feature: The Centennial Celebration of Women at Marquette

In 1909, Marquette University began admitting religious and lay women. It was the first Catholic university in the world to offer coeducation as part of its undergraduate program. Today, more than 50 percent of Marquette students are women, and the university offers a women's and gender studies major and minor.

The research of two doctoral students has culminated in the Raynor Memorial Libraries' acquisition of new archival materials. **Monica Gallamore**, a doctoral student in history, is conducting research on the entertainer, **Hildegarde**. Her research uncovered a trove of the singer's personal papers in New York.

Lincoln Rice, a doctoral student in religious studies, is researching **Dr. Arthur Falls**, a Catholic African American physician. His research turned up an unpublished 600-plus page typed memoir. Both collections have enduring historical value and are now available at Marquette for use by other researchers.

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6. Financial Aid: Apply for Student Research Travel Awards

Travel awards are available to assist graduate and professional students in presenting the results of their research at academic conferences. Each travel award can match dollar-for-dollar up to \$300 of travel funds granted from other sources. This is a matching award. Students must have secured some funding from their department, department's college, or other source before they can be considered for the Graduate and Professional Student Research Travel Award.

Students in all graduate and professional programs are eligible for consideration. To qualify, a student must be enrolled full time in a master's or doctoral program. The majority of awards are made in the fall semester.

The fellowships include round-trip international transportation, research and living allowances, health insurance, and attendance at a mid-year conference in a country in the region. 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11. Resources: Continuation Courses Made (Not So) Easy

The continuous enrollment policy indicates that degree-seeking students must be continuously enrolled, or registered, every fall and spring semester from when they begin their programs until they graduate.

If you've completed all of your classes but are still working on other program requirements, or need a full-time registration status when you are taking fewer than seven credits, you may be able to meet your registration needs by enrolling in one of the graduate continuation courses.

Beginning this fall semester, graduate students who are planning to graduate will be required to submit their theses and dissertations electronically.
