


What We Learned

Preferences for health assets in the NWS reflect nine distinct domains: Investments in young people, Vibrant social spaces, Health and wellness services, Public infrastructure, Alternative modes of transportation, Community-engaged public safety, Sustainable businesses, Strong and inclusive neighborhoods, and High-quality and affordable housing.

• We efficiently incorporated perspectives from NWS residents to form a shared view of health.

• Based on residents' priority ratings we identified several focus areas for interventions and investments to advance health and health equity in the NWS of Milwaukee.

Next Steps

Disseminate findings within the Near West Side community through town halls, blog posts, and social media.

Pilot College of Nursing/Resident Health Action Teams to address identified needs.
