\*The mediation clinic meets for 9 weeks (May 19 through July 26) and includes scheduled clinical hours. Students who have not completed Mediation Training will be required to attend training sessions. The clinic and the training total three credit hours. The Law School will also offer a variety of clinical, judicial internship, and supervised fieldwork opportunities during the 2008 summer session. In addition to the Mediation Clinic noted above, judicial internships will be available with a number of trial and appellate judges in both the federal and state court systems. Numerous supervised fieldwork placements are also expected to be available, including those at the AIDS Resource Center, Catholic Charities Immigration Project, Centro Legal, Legal Action of Wisconsin, Legal Aid Society, Milwaukee County Corporation Counsel, Milwaukee County District Attorney Restorative Justice Program, US Attorney for the Eastern District of Wisconsin, U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, Wisconsin Department of Justice Legal Services Division, Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Bureau of Legal Services, the Equal Rights Division of the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development, and perhaps others. Scheduling in these programs is flexible and will be arranged to fit the needs of the student as well as the agency involved. See Professor Hammer for details.
