Dr. Larry Hurtado has published widely on Christian origins and earliest Christ devotion. He is the author of *Lord Jesus Christ* (2003) and is finishing a manuscript on the challenges that early Christianity posed to pagan culture titled *Destroyer of the Gods: Christian Distinctiveness in the Roman Empire* (2016).

The **Père Marquette Lecture** was established in 1969 under the auspices of the Marquette University Department of Theology. The series was endowed by the children of Joseph A. Auchter (1894–1986), a Milwaukee banker, in honor of their father. In keeping with its history, the lectureship continues to recognize and honor theologians of international renown whose work has made an outstanding original contribution to the field. The lectures are published with the Marquette University Press.
